- Attend and contribute to meetings, events, and working groups, helping to shape key discussions and decisions
- Champion the voice of young members, ensuring they are heard, included, and central to everything we do
- Work collaboratively with volunteers, advisers, staff and young members to develop and deliver projects, events and activities
- Promote opportunities across GGU, encouraging participation from both young members and volunteers
- Identify areas for growth and improvement, helping to enhance the experience across the organisation

- A committed and enthusiastic adult volunteer, aged 18–30 who is passionate about supporting young people through Girlguiding
- A confident communicator who can share ideas clearly and listen to a range of perspectives
- Someone organised and reliable, balancing this role alongside other commitments
