Help lead County Executive meetings

Assist with meetings using the Girlguiding Ulster agenda, adapting it to reflect your County's priorities and plans.

Support and delegate

Work closely with your County and Assistant County Commissioners, and support Lead Volunteers and District Commissioners to deliver the County action plan.

Act as a trustee

Share responsibility for good governance, ensuring the County is well run, sustainable and meeting its objectives.

Build and support your team

Recruit, appoint and guide volunteers in key roles, offering encouragement and acting as a point of support when needed.

Champion and develop volunteers

Recognise contributions, celebrate achievements and encourage volunteers to grow and progress.

Represent Girlguiding

Build local relationships and work with others across Ulster to share ideas and strengthen guiding.

Support and Training

You'll receive a thorough induction to help you settle into the role, along with opportunities to attend Girlguiding UK events for County Commissioners. Relevant training will be provided, including trustee training and A Safe Space Level 4. Agreed expenses will be reimbursed, and you'll benefit from ongoing support from the Chief Commissioner, her team, and Girlguiding Ulster staff, as well as regular Commissioner calls with Girlguiding UK.



Skills and Qualities

This role is well suited to someone who is supportive, approachable and confident working with a wide range of people. Strong communication and listening skills are important, along with the ability to handle sensitive information with care.

You'll also need to be able to prioritise, delegate and manage your time effectively—helping others play to their strengths while ensuring things run smoothly across the County.
