

## COUNTY PEER EDUCATOR COORDINATOR role information

The **County Peer Education Coordinator** role is an exciting opportunity to be part of the County team of volunteers to deliver good guiding in your County and to ensure that girls have amazing opportunities. This is for a term of **3 years** and is a Girlguiding Ulster **County Commissioner** appointment. You will be expected to attend County Executive along with any ad hoc meetings as required.









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## As County Peer Education Coordinator what will I be expected to do?

While the County Commissioner leads the County this does not mean that the County Commissioner does everything herself. One of your key duties will be to support the peer educators to do their role brilliantly. You'll help them grow their leadership skills supporting them to step up, build their confidence and make a difference.

You will be part of a team of Volunteers who will help deliver the County action plan. You will be expected to attend County Executive meetings and report on your areas of work. The members of the County Executive are the trustees of the County and as such, in addition to their own areas of expertise, they will have joint responsibility for ensuring that the County is well run, financially viable and delivering on what the County is expected to do.

### As County Peer Education Coordinator your role will include;

Linking up peer educators with leaders in your area who want a peer education session

Organise and help lead training events – either day-long, residential or virtual – to grow the number of peer educators in your area and develop the skills of members already in the role

Promote the peer education programme and share your passion with others

Work with peer educators to develop their skills through a personal development plan

Bring together networks of peer educators to help share skills and experiences and support one another

Celebrate the amazing things peer educators do and support them to get their badges

Helping to safeguard the peer educators and the people they run workshops with. You'll also support them if something difficult comes up during a session









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
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### What training and support will be available?

Time management skills – getting things done efficiently and planning
