You'll not only influence best practices locally, but also represent Girlguiding Ulster at national meetings, sharing insights, and ensuring volunteers' voices are heard. It's a chance to build leadership skills, connect with people, and have a lasting, meaningful impact on both volunteers and young members alike.



Some of what you'll do

- Act as a positive health and safety role model, promoting good practice across Girlguiding Ulster
- Support and guide volunteers to confidently follow Girlguiding's health and safety policies
- Share practical advice and help with everyday queries, including risk assessments and challenges
- Champion key initiatives and help embed simple, effective ways of managing health and safety
- Encourage open conversations and engagement with volunteers
- Work closely with national leads and HQ to improve processes and share feedback from volunteers
- Represent Girlguiding Ulster and contribute to meetings, projects, and occasional events
- Provide support in more complex situations, including helping with or advising on investigations

Girlguiding Ulster will support you every step of the way, offering guidance from experienced safety practitioners and mentoring from the National Health & Safety Lead Volunteer, with optional one-to-one support. You'll have opportunities to build your skills and confidence through regular meetings, updates, and events, including the annual Safeguarding, Safety and Wellbeing Conference. Alongside this, you'll be part of a supportive network of volunteers, giving you space to share experiences, learn from others, and grow in the role.



This role is offered as a 5-year term, and reasonable expenses will be reimbursed in line with Girlguiding's expenses policy.

To support you in your role, and ensure the safety of all members, you will be required to hold (or be willing to compete) Safe Space Level 4.

This is a rewarding opportunity to challenge yourself, develop new skills, and play an important part in the future of Girlguiding Ulster.
