Girlguiding Ulster Overview

2019 has been a brilliant end of the decade for Girlguiding Ulster!

Together we took part in Future Girl Acts, have had three international adventures, fundraised over £13,000 and opened our brand new Robinson Village at Lorne Estate, with \$ wooden cabins.

29 schools took part in team-building days or activity residentials in 2019.

This has enabled **1,370** pupils and teachers to have new experiences, create positive peer relationships, build their confidence and resilience, and have fun.

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Lorne Estate welcomes not only Girlguiding members through its gates, but other uniformed organisations, youth and church groups, schools and corporate groups.

In 2019 we had **10,314** guests using Lorne Estate's excellent facilities.

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We ran our popular Easter and Summer Schemes again in 2019.

1,872 children joined us to have new adventures, make friends and challenge themselves.



In May 2019 we were delighted to open our brand new wooden cabin accommodation, Robinson Village, with \$ six-berth cabins providing an option for groups between camping and residential.

This brings our total capacity to a huge 642 guests, with:

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94 in indoor accommodation

48 in Robinson Village

500 across our three fully-equipped campsites

We made efforts to become more green by increasing our recycling, placing food bins in each building, replacing bulbs with LED bulbs, reducing our single-use plastic consumption and collecting crisp packets to send to Terracycle.

We also planted close to **800** trees with some help from the Woodland Trust.

We maintained our f star Northern Ireland Tourist Board rating for group accommodation, as well as our AAIAC Adventure Mark standard.

Our Outdoor Activities Manager achieved his Vertex Operational Inspection and Maintenance qualification.

We were successful in an application to the Education Authority, becoming an approved centre for their youth residential programmes.

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Building Our Movement

As part of our Farm Safety Partnership, Girlguiding Ulster attended the Balmoral Show for the third year running. We met with our members, recruited new volunteers and talked to girls and young women about the opportunities that Girlguiding can give them.

Our Cool FM and Downtown Radio campaigns saw an increase in Join Us enquiries.

Our Belfast Bus Campaign in January resulted in **30** new Join Us enquiries.

76 commissioners, trainers, and lead volunteers attended our EPIC conference on 9th March 2019.

Volunteers were empowered, inspired and challenged in their work with other adult members, girls and young women to promote all Guiding opportunities.

49 volunteers attended a Growth and Retention Afternoon Tea event in May 2019.

UK Parliament Week

87 units and **2,254** members from Girlguiding Ulster took part in UK Parliament Week 2019, learning more about parliament and how they can have their say! Our Task & Finish group worked hard to develop our activities for the resource.

We celebrated the week with 120 members at Stormont. We had a tour of the building and learnt more about single-use plastic pollution from Action For Change participants, Sarah and Grace. We debated with an all-female panel of 4° MLA's representing some of the main political parties in Northern Ireland about the environment and climate change. The event was led by another Action For Change participant, Dara.

CANCER SUPPORT

Together we raised a huge **£13,283** for our Chief Commissioner Charity 2019, Macmillan Cancer Support.

This provided **474** hours of vital care, helping everyone with cancer live life as fully as they can.

Volunteers reached out to **105** patients as we continued our involvement with the Royal Belfast Hospital for Sick Children.

270 Brownies designed t-shirts as part of our 'Saving the Planet' mobile artwork project to brighten up the corridors of the hospital.

We sent **227** resources and **10,254** badges from the old Girlguiding programme to a charity in Nigeria that will use them to educate children.

Future Girl

In 2019, Girlguiding launched Future Girl to help create changes to make a difference to the lives of girls and young women all over the UK.



The first of 5 themes, Planet Protectors aims to take better care of our precious planet, and of the animals that we share it with.

From 30th September to 6th October 2019, members across the UK took part in **Future Girl** Acts... On Plastic. This was a social action week tackling single-use plastic and pressuring the government to reduce their consumption.



169 units from Girlguiding Ulster signed up for the week of action, completing the Future Girl Acts... On Plastic UMA and making their plastic promises.



1,245 Ulster members earned their Future Girl Acts... On Plastic badge. As a result, 113,754 Girlguiding members and members of the public made a plastic promise to reduce their single-use plastic consumption
